

CAVANAGHS USED CAR WARRANTY

STEERING:

All internal parts including: power steering ram, power steering pump and lines.

ENGINE:

All internal parts contained in the cylinder block and head assembly, water pump and fuel injection pump.

BRAKES:

All brake components except frictional materials e.g. Brake Pads, shoes, discs.

FRONT SUSPENSION:

Upper and lower control arms, control arm shaft bushing, upper and lower ball joints, swivel pins and bushings, spindle and spindle supports, wheel bearings. Not included are: front end alignment and wheel balancing.

TRANSMISSION:

All internal parts on both manual and automatic transmissions.

TIMING BELT:

Timing belts are covered. It is our policy to change timing belts if the car is approaching the due date for renewal as per manufacturer's guidelines.

REAR AXLE:

All internal parts including: bevel gears and pinion differential unit, shafts, bearings, oil seals, and constant velocity joints.

DRIVE SHAFT:

All parts including universal joint bearings and oil seals.

WHEEL BEARING:

Wheel bearings.



EXCLUSIONS:

1. Those regarded as service items or components which are expected to require periodic replacement e.g. oil and filters (oil, air, fuel and pollen).
2. Wheels and tyres, tracking, spark plugs, wiper blades and arms, auxiliary drive belts, brake shoes, pads and discs, batteries (if due to power drain), lamps and bulbs, fuses, wiring, connections and looms (if caused by external reasons), radio aerial masts and motors, clutch components due to wear and tear or if burnt out and distorted, bodywork and paintwork (not caused by natural occurrence), all weathership and seals, all glass including heater elements, trim, upholstery including cosmetic finishes or the adjustment of any component, radiator (if caused by external reasons). The insurer/customer is responsible for any costs for work carried out or diagnostics which are not covered by warranty. If a vehicle is due for servicing, this must be done before any diagnostic work is carried out.
